Granting NOC for the introduction of new technical courses i.e. MBA and MCA regulated by AICTE in Non - Technical Degree Colleges

- 1. Higher Education Institutions interested in starting any of these new courses will have to submit the application as per format given in **Annexure I**.
- 2. Applications that are found to be in order in all respects shall be processed further for physical examination by the 3 member Expert Committee/Inspection committee (at least one expert).
 - 2.1 The Expert Committee shall physically visit the premises of the Institution to verify the following (Details mentioned in Annexure II):
 - a. Readiness with respect to Built-up Area Requirements .
 - b. Readiness with respect to Computer Software, Internet, Printers and Library facilities.
 - c. Separate Head of the Department and 75% faculty for proposed courses must be identified and recruitment must be in process at the time of the visit.
 - d. Infrastructure/ Equipment as per syllabi must be procured and in operational stage.
 - e. Procurement of books and journals as per norms.
 - f. Collaboration with Institutions for Placement.
 - g. Collaboration with nearby industries/banks for providing internships to the students
 - h. A projection of the minimum requirement of funds for various purposes including pay of the teaching/non-teaching staff/books/ equipment/ furniture etc.
 - i. Proof of adequate working capital, in addition to the funds for certificate/degree course i.e five lacs for post graduate, in form of fixed deposit receipt (FDR) pledged with Director Higher Education, Haryana in respect of Non government colleges to introduce a new technical course in the college.

- 3. 'After the Evaluation, the proposal shall be forwarded for the approval by the EM and if the Institution is deemed to be fit for the issuance of "No Objection Certificate", it shall be issued on the following conditions:
 - a. No financial assistance/ grant in any form at any stage will be given by the State Government. The institution will be responsible to bear all the recurring and non-recurring expenses.
 - b. The institution will seek affiliation from the concerned University for the course (and send a copy to the Department of Higher Education, Haryana) and shall follow all other conditions imposed by the affiliating University, AICTE and Government.
 - c. The institution will follow all the guidelines of the affiliating University for the recruitment of staff and staff strength.
 - d. There shall be reservation of seats for SC/ BC/OBC/Specially abled (Divyangjan)/ Ex-servicemen, Sports persons, Freedom Fighters and any other reserved category as per the State Government Policy.
 - e. The government shall be competent to impose any other condition(s) at any time which shall be binding on the College Management.
 - f. The NOC will be issued from the academic session mentioned above, however if the college fails to start the Course, the Directorate of Higher Education must be informed.
 - g. In case, the institute is not able to run/ sustain the course, the NOC will be withdrawn.
 - h. Any contravention of the above stated conditions shall result in withdrawal of the "No Objection Certificate" with a prior one month notice and legal actions against the defaulting College will be taken as follows:-
 - Any institution running the course in violation of above set regulations shall be liable to appropriate initiation of penal civil action.
 - If any institution contravenes any of the provision of concerned regulations the council after making such enquiry as it may consider appropriate and after giving institution concerned, an opportunity of being heard, under appropriate regulations, withdraw the approval to the concerned course.

- Provided further that in case of such a withdrawal the operation of such said course shall not be started again before completion of two academic years from the date of such a withdrawal.
- Provided further that the students admitted to the institute whose approval has been withdrawn shall be redistributed to other institutions in the jurisdiction of the affiliating university by the competent authority of the respective state government.
