Proceedings of the meeting held under the Chairmanship of Sh. Sudhir Rajpal, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, Home Department

A meeting under the Chairmanship of Sh. Sudhir Rajpal, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, Home Department, was held on 16th February, 2026 to review the implementation of the New Criminal Laws and their status on the NCL Portal, followed by a review meeting on 3rd February, 2026 to assess progress on the proceedings and targets set, and to address pending issues.

The Chair reviewed the status of implementation of the New Criminal Laws in the State, with specific reference to data entry, updations, and compliance on the NCL Portal. The concerned officers briefed the Chair on the present status, issues encountered, and the corrective measures being undertaken.

Agenda-1: Implementation and Monitoring of e-Summons under New Criminal Laws:

The Chair reviewed the status of e-Summons implementation, noting that 70% have been served electronically. Directions were issued to ensure 100% electronic service, modify the format to enable video conferencing, and coordinate with the Registrar General, Punjab and Haryana High Court. The NIC e-Summons App under ICJS, integrated with court systems and CCTNS, is to be fully utilized. The Director of Prosecution was directed to instruct Public Prosecutors to coordinate with respective courts in this regard. Sh. Parveen, ADA, Nodal Officer to submit fortnightly progress reports.

Agenda—2: Adoption of e-Summons System by Revenue Courts:

It was decided that the Chief Secretary, Haryana be requested to issue instructions to all Administrative Secretaries to ensure use of e-Summon for service of summons in their respective courts. The Chair further directed that Revenue Courts also adopt the e-Summon Application for issuance and service of summons. It was apprised that necessary instructions have already been issued by the Additional Chief Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management, and that e-Summon is being adopted in Revenue Courts.

Agenda—3: Examination of Government Officer Witnesses through Video Conferencing

The Chair directed that examination of Government officer witnesses be conducted 100% through video conferencing in accordance with Section 530 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, apprised that concerned officers may send an email to the respective District Attorney for arranging video conferencing in the concerned case and court. It was decided that all Administrative Secretaries be requested to issue necessary instructions to officers and officials under their respective departments to adopt video conferencing for court appearances.

Agenda 4: Development of App-based Prosecution Sanction System

It was decided that an online app-based dashboard for according prosecution sanctions be developed to ensure time-bound, expeditious, and transparent handling of cases in accordance with the provisions of the BNSS. The General Manager, HARTRON, shall be requested to develop the application, and the Secretary, Home-I, shall coordinate the matter. The system shall be made operational within three months.

Agenda—5: Zero FIR and Electronic FIR Registration

The Chair emphasized strict implementation of Zero FIR and electronic FIR registration, noting that the State's performance on the NCL Dashboard remains below average. Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS (AIG), was directed to take immediate corrective steps, and Sh. Romil Lamba, DDA, Nodal Officer to monitor progress and submit fortnightly reports. The DGP was directed to issue instructions to all Superintendents of Police to ensure compliance. It was further directed that all complaints seeking registration of FIR be duly registered and receipts issued, and that action taken on each complaint be communicated to the complainant to ensure transparency and accountability.

Agenda—6: Police Citizen Services and Mandatory Complaint Registration through SARAL Portal

Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, apprised that the Haryana Antyodaya-SARAL portal offers multiple police-related citizen services online, ensuring faceless, transparent, and time-bound delivery, thereby reducing visits to police offices. Ms. Nikita, IPS, further informed that all police services will soon be made available on the SARAL portal. The feasibility of developing a dedicated Digi App for secure and user-friendly delivery of SARAL services, along with enhanced publicity of SARAL Kendras through targeted outreach and awareness campaigns, was discussed. The Chair directed that registration of complaints through the SARAL portal for processing of FIRs be made mandatory and that the DGP issue necessary instructions to ensure strict compliance across the State. It was further apprised by Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, that any person can lodge an online complaint through the Haryana Police portal. The Chair decided that wide publicity of the portal be undertaken through the Information and Public Relations Department by way of advertisements and awareness campaigns.

Agenda 7-Status of Implementation of "Nyaya Shruti"

Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, apprised the Chair about "Nyaya Shruti," a video conferencing mechanism for court appearances, with Karnal selected as the pilot district. A model draft for virtual appearance has been submitted to the Registrar General, Punjab and Haryana High Court and is awaiting approval. It was informed that once operational, the system will enhance public access, integrate with the NCL Dashboard, and improve performance monitoring, efficiency, and transparency in justice delivery. The Chair directed the Secretary, Home-I, to take up the matter with the Registrar General for early approval and implementation.

Agenda 8- Ensuring 100% Online Consumption of FIRs and Challans to Improve NCL Scoring

The Chair directed that 100% online consumption of FIRs and challans by courts be ensured. Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, apprised that in some cases courts are not opening or consuming online-submitted FIRs and challans, adversely affecting the State's NCL portal score. The Assistant Director, NIC, was instructed to coordinate with the courts to ensure strict compliance. The Chair further directed the Director of Prosecution to issue instructions to all Public Prosecutors to coordinate with their respective courts and ensure 100% online consumption of challans and related documents.

Agenda. 9- Implementation of E Sakshya

e-Sakshya is a digital evidence management system aimed at ensuring scientific, transparent, and tamper-proof collection, storage,

and presentation of evidence, with features such as time-stamping, geo-tagging, secure chain of custody, and integration with systems like Nyaya Shruti and the NCL Dashboard. The Chair directed the DGP to issue semi-official letters to all Superintendents of Police to ensure 100% implementation of e-Sakshya, with a copy to the Home Department. Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, shall apprise the progress in the next meeting.

Agenda- 10: Review and Corrective Action for Low-Performing Districts under NAFIS

The Chair directed Shri Himanshu Garg, IPS, AIG, to analyse NAFIS data to identify least-performing districts based on key indicators such as biometric uploads, accuracy rate, pendency, and inter-district matching efficiency. He was instructed to review bottlenecks, conduct district-wise reviews with supervisory officers, and issue necessary directions. Corrective measures, including capacity building, technical support, and enhanced monitoring, are to be implemented to achieve measurable improvement within one month.

Agenda Item 11: E-Witness Data Review

Shri Logesh, DCP Jhajjar, shall provide a list of categories of witnesses for whom e-witnessing may be made compulsory. The same data has been supplied to Sh. Himanshu Garg, IPS, for analysis and submission of a progress report in the next meeting. Based on the findings of this flagship study, the e-witness framework will be implemented across the State.

Agenda Item 12: Engagement the manpower for maintaining the Home Dashboard and others works in the State.

For proper management, maintenance, and regular updation of the portals of the Home Department, the following manpower has been assessed as necessary: two Developers/Data Analysts, one Web Designer (UX/UI), two Programmers, one System Analyst/DBA, and one Senior System Analyst-cum-Team Manager. The Secretary, Home-I, was directed to submit a proposal in the matter for further consideration. Total: 7 posts

The above manpower/server for storage the Data will be required to data analysis, designing of Dashboards, programming support, database administration and overall supervision of the system. This arrangement will ensure accuracy, timely updations and effective management of the Home Dashboard Portal.

A Project Management Unit (PMU) to be established for effective monitoring and management of the project activities of Home Department. For the functioning of the PMU, certain infrastructure and equipment are required.
